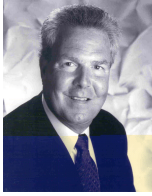

### Implant Dentistry: *“Taking the First Steps With Hands-On Experience”*

#### **Course Objectives:**

Today’s “Standard of Care” for replacing missing teeth requires presenting implant Dentistry as one of the treatment plan options. Implant Dentistry is continuously evolving into a more predictable form of therapy. Optimizing functional and aesthetic results requires control of all phases of the implant process. This program is designed for dentists who want to learn how to place implants and increase control of the process while increasing the bottom line. One of the purposes of this program is to learn the basics of implant patient communication, basics of implant surgery, including soft and hard tissue management, and staying out of trouble through proper case selection and treatment. After successful completion of this 10 hour program, Dentists with minimal or no experience will be capable of diagnosing and treatment planning implant patients in their practices. They will be able to determine if they wish to continue in their implant education with “live surgical hands-on” training. Those attendees with moderate experience in implant therapy successfully completing the program will be capable of Endopore and Pitt-Easy implant placement and restoration.

### Operative Dentistry: *“What’s New in Plain Old Operative Dentistry?”*

#### **Course Description:**

Operative Dentistry continues to be the “Bread and Butter” for most general dental practices. Effective preventive programs and the introduction of improved materials and techniques have broadened the focus of many practices from primarily treating dental disease to addressing a patient’s esthetic concerns even in the absence of disease. However, with this change has come a rapid evolution of tooth-colored materials and esthetic techniques which have challenged practitioners to remain current. Providing patients high quality dentistry without allowing a practice to unknowingly become a part of an industry clinical trial should be the goal of each clinician. This course aids the practitioner by offering unbiased state-of-the-art information on dental materials as well as clinical techniques that can be predictably applied in most practices.

**Objectives:** At the conclusion of this program the attendee will:

- Understand how to layer composites for maximum esthetics
- Understand how to efficiently and predictably place posterior composites
- Know how to start a modern preventive dentistry program
- Know when to leave decay and why
- Know how to manage direct and indirect exposures
- Determine which restorations can be repaired and which should be replaced
- Describe “state of the art” bleaching procedures including a protocol to control sensitivity
- Develop an appropriate light-curing protocol for resin restorative materials
- Select an appropriate core build-up material and bonding system
- Develop a protocol to maximize the longevity of esthetic restorations

## DR. ROBIN RICARDO DANIELS PRESIDENT NATIONAL DENTAL ASSOCIATION KEYNOTE SPEAKER

Dr. Robin Daniel attended the University of Western Ontario in London, Ontario for his undergraduate studies. He transferred to Howard University College of Dentistry in 1977, where he graduated with a D.D.S. in 1981, and followed immediately with a post graduate degree in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery from Howard University Hospital and the Veterans Administration Medical Center in Washington D.C.

He was hired by Meharry Medical College upon completion of his program to coordinate the undergraduate dental program in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery in 1984, and he taught there until June of 1998. Along with Dr. C. Ray Bennett, he was responsible for the establishment of a post-graduate program in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at Meharry Medical College in 1992, now in its fourteenth year.

Dr. Daniel went into full time private practice in 1998, and is CEO of Dream Team Oral Surgery and Implant Center in Nashville, Tennessee. He is active with the residency program at Meharry and continues to foster a mentoring program in his private practice known as the ADream Team," which enjoys an 80% placement record for students into postgraduate specialty programs around the country. He spent six years on the Board of Trustees of the National Dental Association (NDA). He is a member of the NDA, ADA, TDA, AAOMS, ACOMS, TSOMS, Pan Tennessee Dental Association, Capital City Dental Association, Hispanic Dental Association and the International College of Oral Implantology. Dr. Daniel is also a forensic expert and is a Diplomat of the American Board of Forensic Dentistry and the American Board of Forensic Examiners. He is single and the father of two children, Robbyn and Jason
